

Car Allowance Rebate System (CARS)

It is not normally the function of this newsletter to promote (or condemn) any government program. However, the Car Allowance Rebate System (CARS) may be of interest to people in this club. This program was just passed by Congress, and is expected to become law. In short, it will pay either \$3500 or \$4500 for people to scrap older cars deemed as "less fuel-efficient", and purchase a new, "more fuel-efficient" car. The official website www.cars.gov gives the following guidance:

Your vehicle must be less than 25 years old on the trade-in date Only purchase or lease of new vehicles qualify

Generally, trade-in vehicles must get 18 or less MPG (some very large pick-up trucks and cargo vans have different requirements)

Trade-in vehicles must be registered and insured continuously for the full year preceding the trade-in

You don't need a voucher, dealers will apply a credit at purchase Program runs through Nov 1, 2009 or when the funds are exhausted, whichever comes first.

The vehicle that you are trading in is required to be destroyed. Therefore, the value you negotiate with the dealer for your trade in is not likely to exceed its scrap value. The law requires the dealer to disclose to you and estimate of the scrap value of your trade-in vehicle.

So, if your are planning to purchase a new BMW, and have an older dilapidated vehicle that you rarely use (and is low in value), the above could apply. Please see the above-mentioned website after July 1st for additional details. Again, the club takes no position in favor of, or against, this new program.
