# 2010 Spring Tour to the Very Large Array Another Great Turnout!

The New Mexico Chapter's Spring tour was held on April 10, 2010, with approximately 17 BMWs attending event. The tour was top-down driving event for those that came out in roadsters and convertibles. Seventeen automobiles, mostly BMWs attended this tour to the Very Large Array (VLA), which is located 50 miles west of Socorro on U.S. Highway 60.

The VLA is a radio astronomy observatory that was also where Carl Sagan's 1980 documentary *Cosmos: A Personal Voyage* was featured. The Bimmer group consisted mainly of several 3 series (E30, E36, E46), many Z 3s, a 5 series GT, and non-BMWs: an Audi A4 and a Pontiac Solstice - an appropriate car name for the event! We even had several members from the El Paso area participate. The Convoy departed the Sandia dealership under top down weather, driv-

ing south on I-25 and exiting Socorro, NM, where headed west on NM Hwy 60 through the towns of Magdalena and Datil. As our BMW convoy of 17 plus cars approached the VLA, off in the distance it was hard not to notice what appeared to be large white mushrooms poking through the horizon and into the sky.

Tech tip #391: I really like the M52/M54 series of BMW engines (the fabulous inline 6). It is an exceptionally smooth and powerful engine. The M52/M54 is also very durable, <u>IF</u> it is maintained properly. One of the areas that needs attention is the cooling system. Many technical experts now recommend replacing the water pump, thermostat, and expansion tank <u>preventatively</u> every 60,000 miles.

(From Pg 1) and is a facility of the National Science Foundation. NRAO operates several other radio telescopes throughout the United States.



**Judy Stanley Provides Chapter Members A Detailed Explanation of VLA Operations Center Happenings** 

Ms. Stanley provided a 2-hour detailed tour of the VLA and described how the telescopes are used by astronomers to study cosmic objects ranging from the Sun and the planets of our solar system, to distant galaxies and quasars at the edge of the observable universe. These telescopes analyze radio waves in-



stead of light like optical telescopes.

The antennas are aimed at celestial objects that emit radio waves and are then recorded as a photographic image. Each antenna dish stands (when pointed straight up) 94' in height, the dish is 82' in diameter and each unit weighs an astronomical 235 tons.

Ms. Stanley mentioned that there are 27 antennas that move in sequence and that fighter pilots refer to the VLA as the "Mushroom Farm" as they fly by, practicing their bombing runs at nearby military ranges.



The Spectacular "D" Antenna Configuration

The antennas can be positioned in four configurations and are moved every 4 months on parallel railroad tracks with a specially modified tractor. The resolution allows the astronomer to discern details in a picture, because different astronomical observations require different resolution.

During our visit, the telescopes were what is known as a D-configuration (close configuration), but can be spread far away as 17 miles in diameter. The telescopes repositioned their massive dishes in synchronized fashion several times during our visit providing a truly out-this-world experience. The main operation center for the VLA is located on campus at the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology in Socorro - where astronomers work in concert with other radio antennas located in Hawaii and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

To sustain members on the return trip, our club President, Jon van Arsdel, made arrangements to meet at a Mexican restaurant in Socorro, NM. A special thank you goes to Ms. Judy Stanley from the Very Large Array, for providing an exceptional informational tour of the facility; also to all the drivers making this tour another successful driving event. If anyone had missed this tour, but wants to witness an out-of-this-world experience, the VLA is open to the public as self-guided tours.


