The New México Chapter had the honor of being invited to the first-ever Santa Fé Concorso (thank you Mike Houx, owner of Sandía BMW and the Sandía Automotive Corp.). The Concorso was held September 24 through 26, and was open to the (paying) public on Sunday the 26<sup>th</sup>.

The Santa Fé Concorso was the first event of its type and magnitude to be held in New México. The focus of the show was cars that are historically significant; they had to pass an extensive entry pre-judging and assessment process. The cars on display were absolutely stunning (think Pebble Beach Concours).

Many VIP's in the world of automobiles were at the Concorso. Sir Stirling Moss, arguably one of the greatest-ever racing drivers was at the show. Famous automotive journalist Denise McCluggage was also present. Alma Hill is the widow of Phil Hill, the USA's only F1 champion, and attended with her son Derek Hill. Indy 500 champion Al Unser Sr. of Albuquerque was present. All of the afore-mentioned were on the judging committee.

Approximately 50 historically significant cars were on display. Many brands were well represented, such as Bugatti, Jaguar, Cadillac, Ferrari, Porsche, Mercedes, and Morgan. Many extinct marques were also present, such as Packard, Hudson, and Hupmobile. Mike Houx displayed his gorgeous Ferrari Dino.

A particularly interesting part of the show was called "Then & Now", and included both historical and modern examples of cars such as Bentley, Rolls Royce, Morgan, Mercedes (Gullwing), Corvette, and Mini.

The car club section was in addition to the main show, and had cars from the BMW club, Ferrari club, Porsche club, and Alfa Romeo club. We at the BMW CCA were

fortunate to have 10 BMW's. This is in addition to the other BMW's on exhibit throughout the show. Matt Di-Gregory's 1959 Isetta and Dieter Fox's 1968 2800cs attracted the most attention of the club cars. Matt's 850csi Individual was also a head-turner.

The Sandía BMW display was just inside the front gate. On display were BMW cars, BMW motorcycles, and Minis. A Z8 and a beautifully restored 2002 were part of the exhibit

All of us who attended thought the Santa Fé Concorso was an overwhelming success. Proceeds went to benefit the Boys and Girls Clubs of Santa Fé. I hope the event will be repeated in future years.

#### Removing Convertible Top Stains

With colder weather closing in on us, some of us with rag tops will be garaging our open top rides for the winter. Before you put the car cover on make sure you aren't letting any stains set into the fabric for a 4-5 month period. I've used this technique successfully a time or two—keep it in mind if you are ever faced with a hard-to-remove stain.

Sooner or later, your top will be inflicted with a stain that will not come out with regular shampoo. Common stains include bird droppings, tree sap and grease. For these occasions, you will need to use a stronger cleaner that can penetrate and release the foreign matter. Your first inclination will be to scrub the stain with the regular shampoo. DON'T! All scrubbing will do is spread it around. To remove stains from your canvas or vinyl top, use Wolfstein's RaggTopp Cleaner in full concentration. Spray it liberally on the stain before washing the whole top. Let it soak in, but don't let it dry. After it has soaked for 3 to 5 minutes, rinse your top and wash as usual. Rinse the stained area with a stiff stream of water.
