The new X Drive system allows up to 100 % of torque to be transmitted to either axle like the old system. However, the normal driving mode for the system is front drive only, not 40/60 like the last generation X Drive. It can change it's mind in as little as 250 ms, so it will still be able to keep you off of the curb when you hit the patch of ice on Tramway. It also allows for Launch Control if you have the Sport Package and transmission. Certainly not available on my X1...

BMW has led the way introducing many technologies that we take for granted today. The current G series 7 has technology that one would only dream about even a couple of years ago. With it's key fob you can 'call' the car to back out of the garage and meet you in the driveway. In the future it has the capability to drop you at the front entrance and find it's own parking space. When you've finished your errands you can call it and it will meet you at the entrance ready to go on the next route. Check it out on Youtube. Unlike driver-less cars on the internet blogs the 7 will gladly let you thrash it about on a motorway or even the track though most 7 owners won't be interested in driving that spiritedly in it.

The new 7 Series also features touch screen technology in it's iDrive. No more turning the knob in and out to zoom into a map. Just pinch and swipe like you would on your smartphone. It's voice command also recognizes normal speech patterns so you can ask where the nearest gas station is instead of several one word commands.

Indeed the future is now. With it's commitment to driver input and feedback BMW continues to lead the industry in driving dynamics and pleasure. New materials, software and engineering continue to make our vehicles the envy of the road and allow us to keep the right foot planted well into the next turn.


Tech Tips for your BMW James Irick Map Updates for your Navigation

When I got my new X1 last year I was interested in the navigation function it provided. Up to this point I haven't had a vehicle with built in navigation. I have had to rely on the 'old school' Garmin carry on or at worst my iPhone. As it turns out the iPhone is actually better at navigating and the Garmin is much faster to use then my onboard system. It seems BMW has a few tricks to learn from the established map companies...

One feature I do like is the traffic information that comes through the built in network in the car. It shows slowing traffic in real time on the map as well as a separate menu that shows traffic 'hot spots' and where they are in relation to where I am driving.

As the last year came to a close I wanted to see if I could update the map on the vehicle since the new flyover from I-25 to Paseo del Norte was missing. As it turns out you can order an update direct to your computer and upload it into the car through a USB port in the glovebox. It won't speed up the navigating but the map will be more accurate. Goto the website http://store.bmwgpsmaps.com and enter your vehicle data. BMW recommends you update the maps at least once a year to keep the vehicle maps up to date.

If your vehicle is older than 2010 you'll have to go to the dealer for any updates. If the vehicle is older than the current series models (F series, G series, E84) you will likely have a DVD based navigation system. The dealer would be the source for information on obtaining updates but more than likely the iPhone would be the best bet at that point...
